


AAMCF AWARDS J. RICHARD OLTMANN SCHOLARSHIP

Austin Secor, 18, is from Broomfield, CO. He is a recent graduate from Hope Academy High School. The American Safety and Health Institute certified him as a CPR instructor and trains groups of 5-30 people in first aid. Additionally, he has been acknowledged by the National Honor Society and earned 5 AP college course credits and took 5 honors courses throughout his four years at Hope Academy. He earned his Eagle Scout, First Degree Black Belt and was an assistant instructor at 5280 Black Ice, volunteered at A Precious Child, and participated in trash pickup at City of Westminster and City of Broomfield – all while maintaining a 4.2 grade point average.

Austin expressed his passion for space and we were moved by his dedication to furthering his curiosity by attending Space Camp for three consecutive summers in Huntsville, AL. In his application, Austin wrote, "The camp provides me countless experiences I can't find elsewhere. From simulated moon missions to engineering challenges, I love and excel at them all. These activities give me a chance to lead and experience a whole new level of teamwork."

Austin said, "Receiving the Oltmann Scholarship lightens the stress of paying for college; allowing me to focus more on my academic studies and community outreach. This scholarship has given me a jumpstart on my college career and set me on a path for success."
